atman	The real self or soul.	What are the Big Questions? Sticky Knowledge	How was the world created?
reincarnation	The rebirth of the atman in another body.	Big questions are questions that have no definite answers. As such, people try to answer them in different ways depending on their differing backgrounds and beliefs.	Do people have a soul?
dharma	Fulfilling your duty; doing the right thing.	Christians believe in one God who is all powerful, all knowing and all loving.	What happens when we die?
heaven	A place considered by many faiths to be where God is and where good people go after death.	Christians believe that God consists of three forms/persons known as the Holy Trinity.	Is the world fair?
universe	Earth and space.	Hindus believe that every living thing contains a bit of Brahman that gives it its life = the atman (soul).	
theory	An idea that explains something.	Hindus believe that if they lead a good life (Dharma), their atman will become one with Brahman. This is their ultimate goal.	
Big-Bang	A scientific event believed by some to be the way in which the universe began.	Hindus have many stories and ideas about how the world was created.	Where do people with faith look to find some answers?
equality	All people being equal.	Humanists believe that the universe began by chance. They do not believe in a creator.	Where do people without faith get their answers?
		Humanists look to science for answers about how the world began and believe in the 'Big Bang' theory.	



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
