capital city	A city or town where the government sits.		☐ One of Northern Ireland's most famous landmarks is the Giant's Causeway .
population	How many people live in a particular place. This could be a village, town, city, country or the whole world.		☐ Wales is a country in the west of the UK. Its capital city is Cardiff .
landmark	A feature of a landscape or place that is easily recognised.		☐ Wales has its own language (Welsh) although people speak English there too.
language	A system people use to speak and write to one another. A country often has one or two main languages.		☐ The UK is surrounded by the English Channel, The North Sea, The Irish Sea and the North Atlantic Ocean.
sea	Salt water that covers most of the Earth and surrounds land.

India	India is a country in the continent of Asia. It takes around 9 hours to travel by plane from the UK to India.		☐ Chembakolli is one of many villages inhabited by the Adivasi Tribe .
village	A village is a small group of houses. It is smaller than both a town and city.		☐ Languages spoken in Chembakolli are English and Tamil.
tribe	A group of families who live and work together and share a language and leader.		☐ Children up to 14 years old go to the local school . There is only 1 computer.
forest	A large area covered with trees and plants. Larger than a wood.		☐ Much of the world's honey comes from India. At school, children eat rice and Dhal .
river	A large, natural stream of water that leads to the sea. The main water source for the people of Chembakolli.		☐ More than half of the area around Chembakolli is surrounded by forest .
veranda	A roofed platform that runs along the outside of a house and sits level with the ground.		☐ Many wild animals live in the forest including bison, elephants and monkeys .
kho kho	A popular tag game played in India.		☐ Houses are built with wood, sticks and mud and usually have two rooms and a verandah. Most villages have a temple.
rickshaw	A small three-wheeled taxi used to transport people in India.		☐ Children enjoy skipping, cricket, kho kho, dodgeball and marbles . ☐ People travel by bus, rickshaw, bike and jeep .

thermometer	An instrument used to measure the temperature.		☐ The weather affects what we do and what we wear . If it rains, we wear waterproof clothes to go outside. If it is sunny, we wear sun cream.
weather forecast	A prediction of what the weather will be like in the future.		☐ Filey is a seaside resort. People choose to go out for day trips or on holiday there.
climate	The weather conditions in an area over a long period of time.		☐ Changes in the tide mean that there are times during the day when the beach is completely covered by the sea.
heatwave	A long period of unusually hot weather.		☐ Filey is 1 hour away from Howden.
tide	The rise and fall of the sea.		☐ Human features in Filey include hotels, cafes, souvenir shops and a park.
beach	A pebbly or sandy shore between the sea and a higher land place.		☐ Physical features in Filey include the beach, sea and cliffs.
cliff	A steep rock face usually at the edge of the sea.		
coast	Where land meets the sea.		
resort	A place where people visit often for a holiday (sometimes close to the sea).
