challah bread	Bread baked in celebration of Shabbat.			
tallit	A Jewish fringed prayer shawl.	Who Belongs? Sticky Knowledge		How we show belonging?
kippah	A skullcap worn by some members of the Jewish faith to show respect to God.	Families come in different shapes and sizes. Lots of families look different.		What does it mean to belong to a faith family?
tefillin	A set of small leather boxes containing scrolls with verses from the Torah.	Christians show their belonging by going to church, reading the Bible, saying grace, wearing a cross and helping others.		How does a Christian or Jew show belonging to their faith?
baptism	Ceremony to welcome someone to the Christian faith.	Jewish people show their belonging by going to the synagogue, reading the Torah, wearing a kippah and celebrating Shabbat.		What do they wear/do to show belonging?
godparent	A person who presents a child at baptism and makes promises.	Jewish people celebrate 'Shabbat' each week.		How do they become a member of their faith?
Humanism	A view that there is no god - the meaning of life is to seek happiness and to help others.	People join the Christian faith by being baptised. They make special promises to God.		What do symbols and artefacts tell us about what people believe?
naming ceremony	A way in which parents celebrate birth of a new child.	During a baptism service, the vicar signs the cross and sprinkles water on the person's head.		What promises might a Christian or Jew make?
promise	The act of saying you will certainly do something.	Humanists hold naming ceremonies to welcome a new baby to the world. They make promises to the baby during this service.		Is it ever right to break a promise?
chuppah	A canopy under which Jewish marriage ceremonies are performed.	During a wedding service, people make special promises. The chuppah symbolises the couple's future home together.		Do we need rules? Where do faith members find their life rules?
ketubah	A Jewish marriage contract.	Jewish people place their marriage promises on the wall in their home.		



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
